Diagonal Corners



This block is similar to the Letter C. It has diagonal corner piecing for Locations #2 and 3.

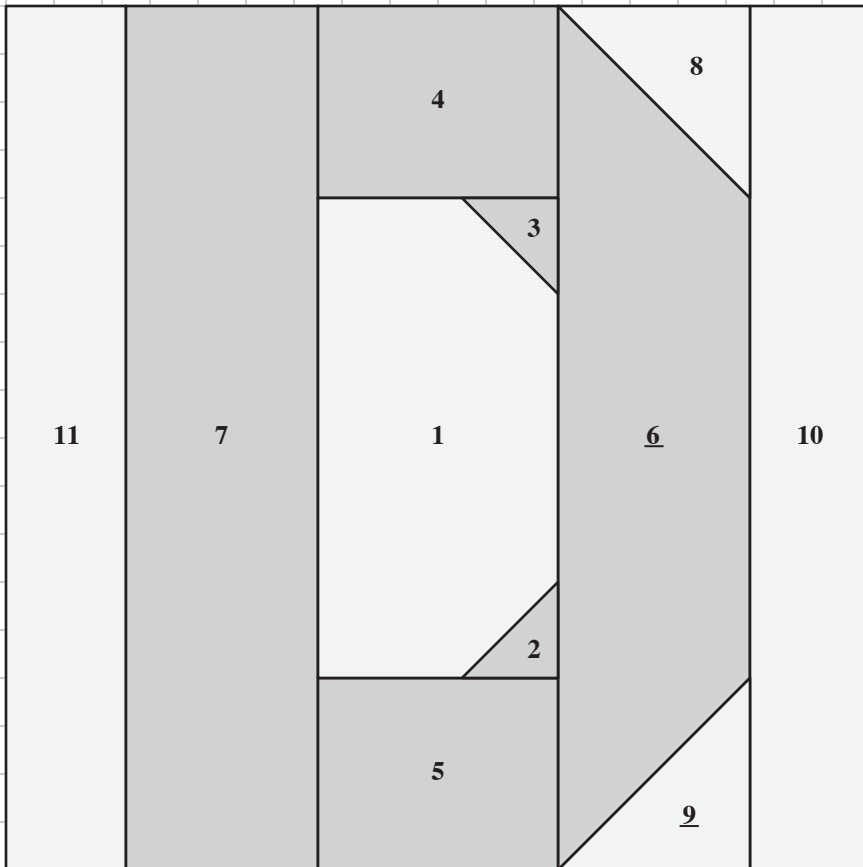
CUTTING FABRIC PIECES

Refer to the Cutting List on Page 2 to cut the fabric pieces. Cut 45° angles from Location #6 as shown in the diagram on Page 2.

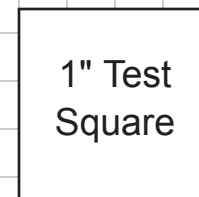
PIECING THE BLOCK

By using the dual feed on my Pfaff performance 2054, which is my favorite sewing machine for block piecing, I was able to sew all of the pieces for this block without pinning.

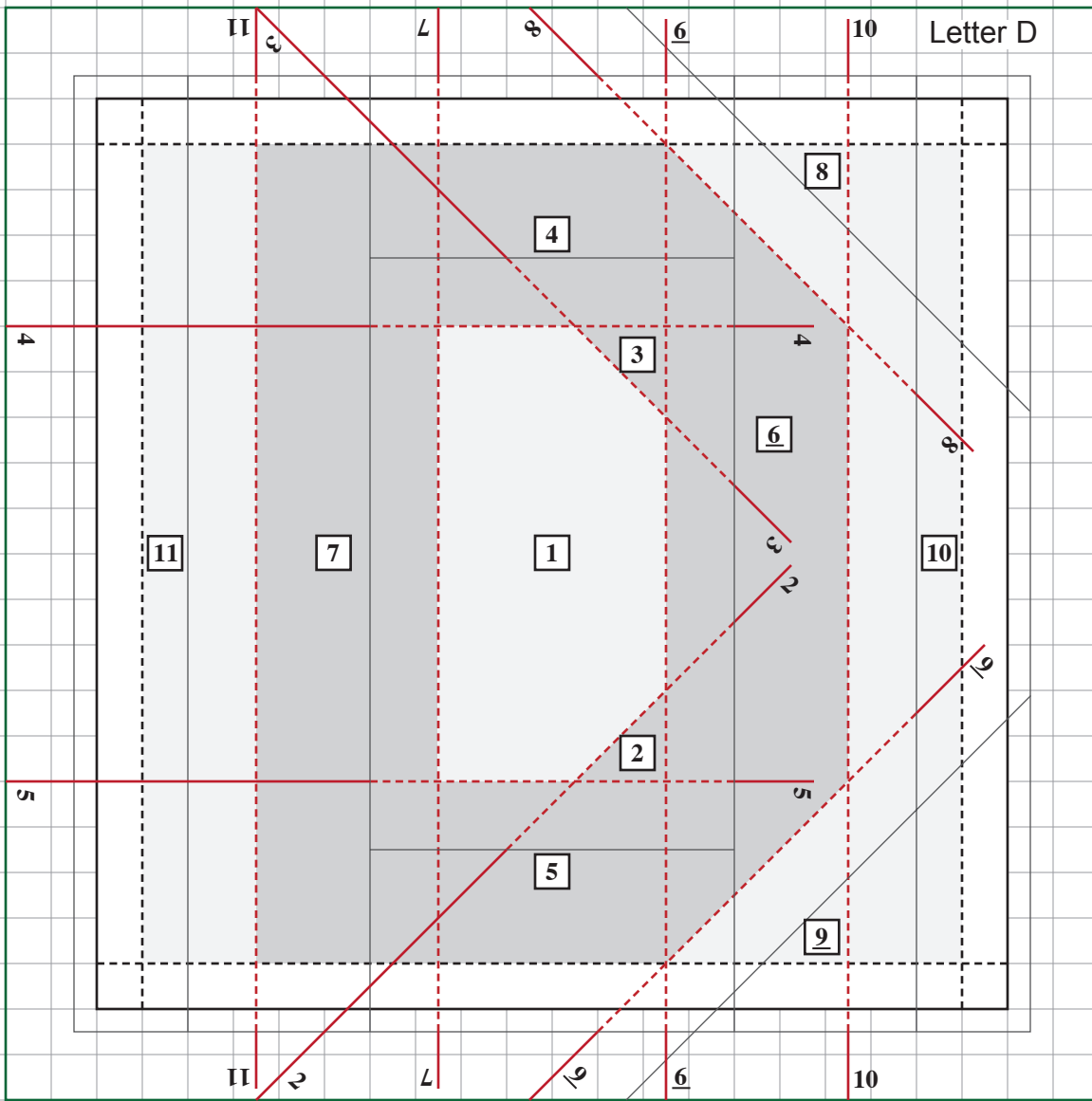
I also sewed 2 pieces at a time before trimming and pressing: #2 and 3, #4 and 5, #6 and 7 (fold 6 out of the way before adding 7), #8 and 9, and #10 and 11.

CUTTING LIST

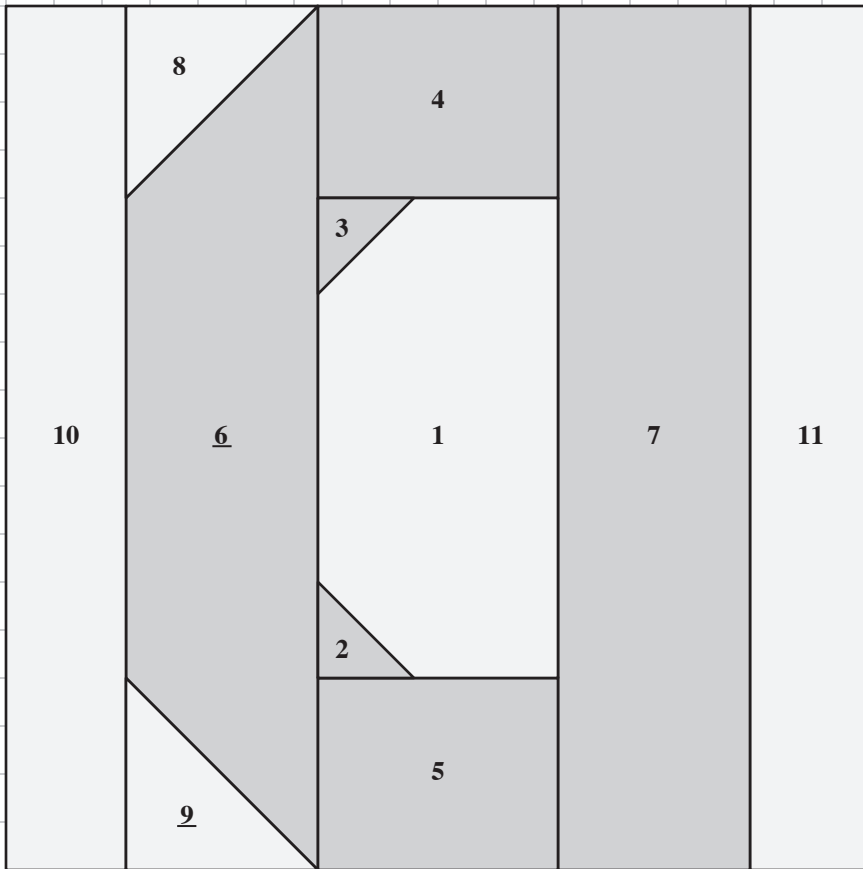
Location	Size to Cut	
1	2" x 3¼"	
2, 3	1¼" x 1¼"	
4, 5	2" x 1¾"	
6	1¾" x 6¼"	
7	1¾" x 5¼"	
8, 9	2⅜" x 2⅜"	
10, 11	1⅜" x 5¼"	

Cut 45° angles from Location 6 as shown.

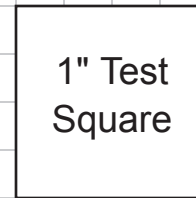
For this block, use the following method to piece Locations #2 and 3.

Diagonal Corner Piecing

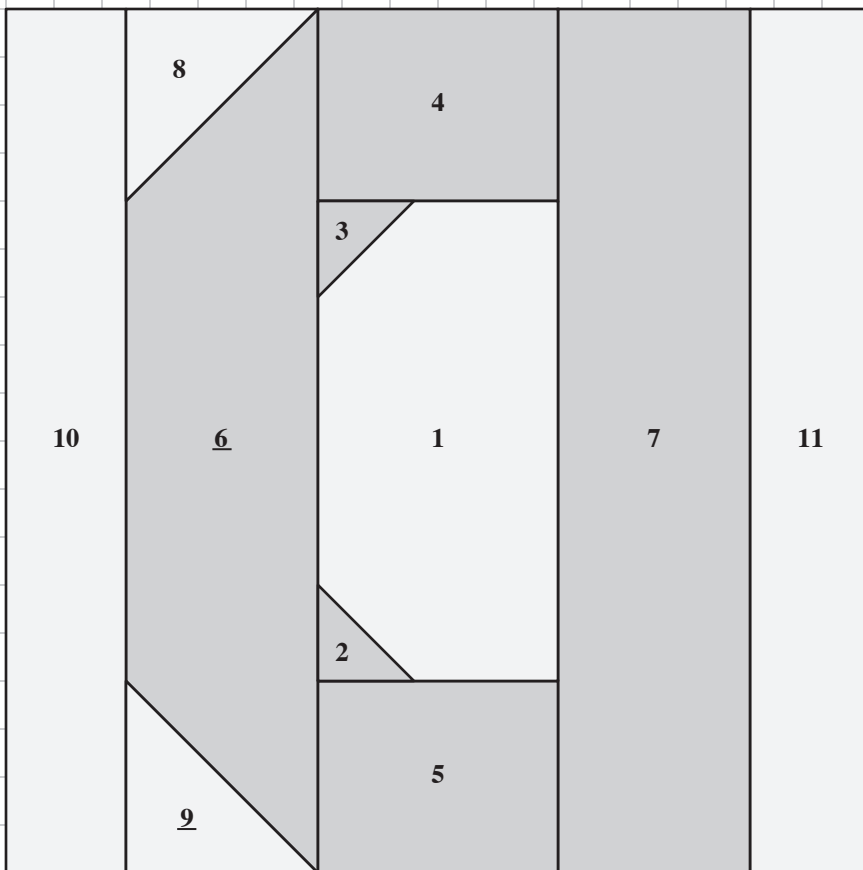
Use this technique to add small triangles to corners of squares and rectangles. Place the larger square or rectangle in position, place the smaller square on one corner and sew from corner to corner. Fold the paper back on the seamline and trim seam to ¼". Open corner piece and press seam.
